Phyllis H. Martin Faculty Chair Endowment

This was the first endowed faculty chair established at Germanna Community College (GCC) in 1998 in honor of Phyllis H. Martin, Culpeper, VA. The purpose of the endowment is to provide direct support to faculty members for initiatives in professional development and teaching excellence.

Criteria:

- Assists in development of full-time teaching and administrative faculty or professional employees at GCC
- Supports special projects of study or research relevant to the mission of GCC
- Applicants must be employed at least 3 years at GCC; be recommended by their immediate supervisor; and received consecutive “very good” or “excellent” performance ratings for 3 years
- Past recipients are not eligible for five years after completion of a project

Elna H. Daniel Endowment

This endowment was established in 2000 by the members of the Daniel family in honor of their mother and grandmother, Mrs. Elna H. Daniel of Madison, VA. The purpose of this endowment is to provide an award to a member of the faculty, student body, or staff to fulfill the mission of GCC.

Criteria:

- Teaching excellence and high standards
- Innovative learning environments that encourage creativity and acquisition of knowledge and skills that prepare students for changing work environments, responsible citizenship, and rewarding lives
- Responsible stewardship
- Commitment to support cultural enrichment, economic development, partnerships, and health and wellness.

D. French Slaughter, Jr. Endowment

The Germanna Community College Foundation established the endowment in 1995 to support the College's educational programs and scholarships, and to preserve the legacy of Congressman Slaughter as a leader in the development of community college education in the Commonwealth of Virginia.
